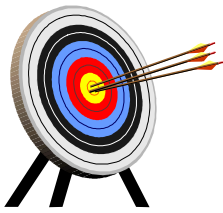


Introducing the “Leicester & Rutland 300”

L&RCAA are pleased to announce a new indoor postal tournament for junior archers.

Beginning in November 2005 the competition will be conducted over a 5 month period ending in March 2006. You can enter as an individual or a team if you have enough club mates who are willing to participate. You can even enter several teams eg KMAC A, KMAC B, KMAC C etc. A team consists of 3 archers (only one compound per team).



The Leicester & Rutland 300 round consists of 3 dozen arrows at 20 yards – but this comprises 1 dozen arrows at three different target faces – a Portsmouth face, a FITA 18 face and a Worcester or PAA face. These three target faces are arranged together on the same boss. The maximum score achievable is 300, hence the name of the round. Note for Compound archers the inner 10 ring rule applies on the Portsmouth and FITA 18 faces.

The suggested shooting pattern is 3 ends of 4 arrows ie a total of 9 ends. The round progresses quite quickly and can easily be accommodated within an evening session. Entry forms can be down loaded from the L&RCAA County website at www.lrcaa.org

Basic Rules.

- The round is to be shot on a designated day and may only be shot once in any month for the purposes of the competition.
- A month means the calendar month.
- 3 archers to constitute a team – usually the 3 best scores on the day. This can include any bow discipline but only one compound per team.
- A club can enter as many teams as it wishes – but an archer can only shoot for a single team in any month.
- Results are to be emailed to the Webmaster by the Team Captain to be received no later than 7 days after the month has ended.
- In the event of any dispute the Webmaster is the sole decision maker (except where a conflict of interest is declared in which case the county executive committee members will be the ultimate arbiters).
- Results will be posted on the County website and there will be individual and team leagues.
- Score sheets are available on the website as are summary forms for emailing to the email address lrcaa300@lrcaa.org by the nominated team captain (must be an adult). Score sheets may be examined and so should be correctly filled in and signed by an adult and retained until the end of the competition.

There will be individual medals for the highest placed individuals in the following disciplines Girl/Boy Recurve, Girl/Boy Compound, Longbow (all disciplines according to entry) and winning team will be presented with The Charlesworth Cup at the awards evening in November 2006.
